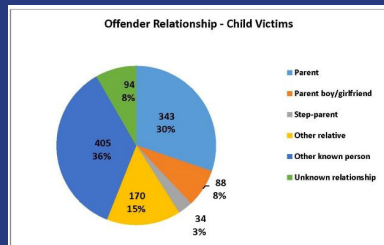
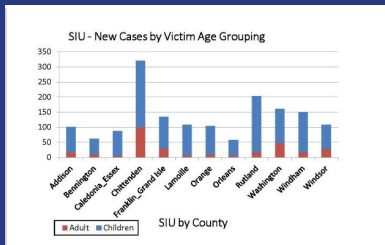

Children's Advocacy Centers offer high-quality care so abused children can thrive

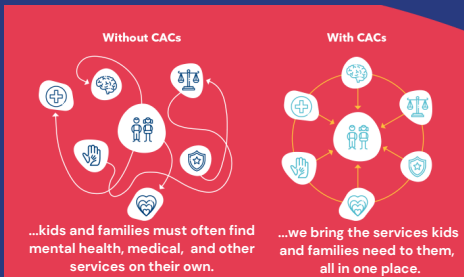


How do CACs help kids and families?

CACs utilize a nationally recognized model using evidence-based practices

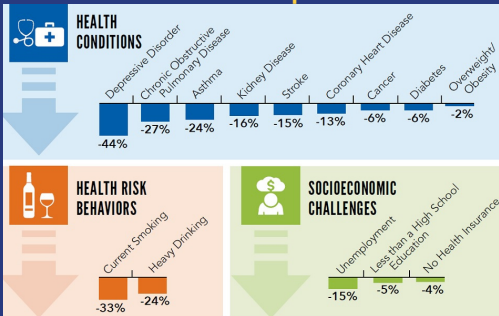


CACs provide specialized services to children referred for concerns of abuse

CACs are part of multidisciplinary teams in their community to ensure the best response

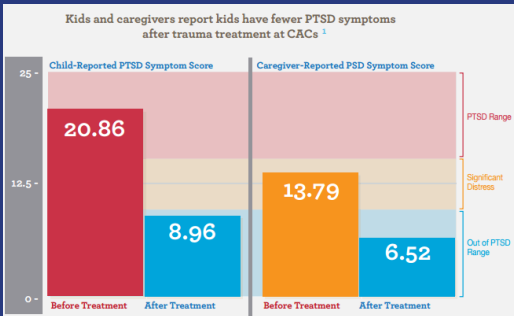
Long-term Impacts of Child Abuse
