Subject: Annual Report - Driver License Suspensions Calendar Year 2020

In 2016, the Vermont Legislature passed Act 147 into law. The aim of the legislation was to limit the use of driver license suspensions to driving offenses and for failure to pay traffic tickets stemming from actual motor vehicle violations.

In accordance with Act 147 of 2016, Section 23, the Department of Motor Vehicles has prepared the following report on Driver License/Privilege-to-Operate Suspensions for Calendar Year 2020.

## Background:

Prior to the enactment of Act 147 of 2016, failure to pay a traffic fine resulted in an indefinite license or privilege- to-operate suspension. Many Vermonters who were unable to pay their initial traffic ticket, but who needed to drive in order to get to work, were left with no option but to drive with their license suspended. Many of these Vermonters would then receive more tickets for driving while their license was suspended and other violations, creating a never-ending cycle of people getting more tickets that they could not pay simply for trying to get to work. As a result, the legislature eliminated the use of license suspensions as an incentive to pay traffic fines.
