

Aviation Program Overview Funding Source

State Apportionment FAA - \$560,000 annually

- Annual funding from FAA \$1.35MM / yr. Non-Primary Entitlement (NPE)
 - ▶ 9 NPIAS airports at \$150,000 / year of NPE
- Airport Generated Revenues:
 - 145 Privately owned hanger leases (some leases include more than 1 bldg.)
 - 12 State owned hangers
 - ▶ 32 Airport leases to businesses (including FBO's)

 30 mission specific missions








