



Support for NLC with Fee Increase




Support for NLC without Fee Increase




County-Level support for the Compact

The majority of Vermont nurse licensees are in favor of Vermont becoming a compact state, even if this results in an increase in fees


Analysis

That number increases when those who do not oppose are added to those in favor

An overwhelming majority are in favor of the compact if there is no associated fee increase

More than 80% of Vermont nurses aged 20-29 expressed an interest in the mobility that the compact provides, and 75% of nurses aged 30-59 expressed that same interest.


State Comparison of Initial Licensure Fees


State Comparison of Endorsement Fees

State Comparison of Renewal Fees



Vermont Nursing Survey

OPR and the Vermont Board of Nursing value the opinions of Vermont Nurses and support the majority who have expressed interest in pursuing Vermont becoming a compact state

Summary

The exact financial impact is unknown and will be monitored closely. Every effort will be made to avoid an impact on fees.

Public Protection is enhanced by information sharing between compact states regarding disciplinary investigations, information that is currently not available outside of the compact.

Participation in the compact does not drive the use of Travel Nurses, vacancies in the state create that demand. Creating a practice environment that nurses value has the potential for decreasing those vacancies. The compact is one vehicle for enhancing the Vermont nurse practice environment.
