## **Overview of Current Legislative Remote Meeting Authority**

This document provides an overview of current remote meeting authority within the General Assembly.

## I. Joint Committees

Pursuant to <u>J.R.S. 2</u>, the General Assembly adopted emergency temporary Joint Rule 22A, which authorizes *the Joint Rules Committee* to permit joint committees of the General Assembly (including itself and conference committees) to meet and vote electronically as the Committee determines appropriate.

- Pursuant to this authority, at its 2/11/21 meeting, the Committee authorized all joint committees to meet and vote electronically.
- By the current terms of temporary Joint Rule 22A, the Committee's authority under this temporary rule terminates upon the expiration of the Governor's COVID-19 state of emergency.
- <u>J.R.S. 24 As Adopted by Senate</u> would amend temporary Joint Rule 22A to provide that the Committee's authority terminates *upon the later of:* 
  - 1) the expiration of the Governor's COVID-19 state of emergency; or
  - 2) January 7, 2022 (the first Friday of the 2022 session).

## II. Senate Sessions and Senate Committees

Pursuant to <u>S.R. 2</u>, the Senate adopted <u>Senate Rules 9A and 32A</u>, which provide that when the Governor declares <u>any</u> state of emergency, *the Senate Rules Committee* is authorized to permit Senate sessions and Senate committees to meet remotely. The Committee's authority terminates upon the expiration of the Governor's state of emergency.

- Thereafter, the Senate adopted <u>S.R. 9</u>, which notwithstands the current provisions of Senate Rules 9A and 32A so that those rules remain in effect *until the later of:* 
  - 1) The expiration of the Governor's COVID-19 state of emergency; or
  - 2) January 7, 2022.

## **III. House Sessions and House Committees**

Pursuant to <u>H.R. 2</u>, the House adopted <u>House Rules 9a and 29a</u>, which provide that *the House shall allow* remote participation in House sessions and that *standing committees are permitted* to vote remotely while the House's declaration of a state of emergency is in effect (or until the convening of the 2023 biennium, whichever comes first).

- Via <u>H.R. 1</u>, the House's initial declaration of a state of emergency was effective through March 9, 2021.
- Via <u>H.R. 8</u>, the House extended its declaration of a state of emergency through May 15, 2021.
