1	§ 1001. CREATION OF COMMITTEE
2	(a) Creation. There is created the Joint Public Pension Oversight Committee for
3	the purpose of working with and providing assistance to other legislative
4	committees on matters related to the State's retirement system and other
5	postemployment benefits.
6	(b) Members. The Committee shall be composed of the following members,
7	who shall be appointed each biennial session of the General Assembly:
8	(1) three members of the House, who shall not be from the same party,
9	appointed by the Speaker of the House; and
10	(2) three members of the Senate, who shall not be from the same party,
11	appointed by the Committee on Committees.
12	(c) Powers and duties. The Committee shall evaluate and make
13	recommendations on the following:
14	(1) issues of public policy related to the provision of retirement benefits to
15	the State's public sector workforce;
16	(2) changes to statutory provisions regarding the provision, design, and
17	administration of retirement benefits and the retirement systems;
18	(3) issues of public policy relating to health benefit design innovations,
19	State regulatory measures, and alternative methods of providing pooled health
20	care benefits to both active and retired school employees to lower health care costs
21	for employees, retirees, school boards, and the State; and
22	(4) the appropriate annual appropriation to fund the State's retirement
23	obligations in accordance with actuarial recommendations, statutory amortization
24	schedules, and funding policies.

1	Joint Public Pension Oversight Committee – 2 V.S.A. § 1001 (d) Policies. The Committee shall elect a chair, vice chair, and clerk from
2	among its members and shall adopt rules of procedure. The Chair shall rotate
3	biennially between the House and Senate members. The Committee shall keep
4	minutes of its meetings.
5	(e) Meetings.
6	(1) When the General Assembly is in session, the Committee shall meet at
7	the call of the Chair.
8	(2) The Committee may meet six times during adjournment and may meet
9	more often subject to approval of the Speaker of the House and the President Pro
10	Tempore of the Senate.
11	(3) A quorum shall consist of four members.
12	(f) Assistance. The Committee shall have assistance from the Office of
13	Legislative Counsel, the Office of Legislative Operations, and the Joint Fiscal
14	Office.
15	(g) Compensation and reimbursement. For attendance at a meeting when the
16	General Assembly is not in session, members of the Committee shall be entitled to
17	compensations for services and reimbursement of expenses as provided under
18	subsection 23(a) of this title.
19	(h) Reports. Annually, on or before December 1 each year, the Vermont
20	Investment Pension Commission and the Boards of Trustees for the State
21	Employees' Retirement System, Teachers' Retirement System, and Municipal
22	Employees' Retirement, shall report to the Committee.
