The hemlock woolly adelgid is an invasive, sap-sucking insect that causes mortality in hemlock trees across the eastern seaboard and other parts of the United States through its feeding. This amendment is necessary to protect Vermont's hemlock resource as hemlock woolly adelgid (HWA) was first reported in Vermont in 2007 and is now established within the state. The existing rule is an external quarantine and only prohibits entry of regulated articles into Vermont. This creates confusion about movement of hemlock from infested counties within Vermont. The amendment is necessary because the existing rule regulates logs, lumber, and chips which, over the past thirty years in Vermont, have not been known to spread hemlock woolly adelgid. Rather, State personel have determined that the primary means of dispersal - pathway of highest risk - concerning the

spread of the pest is transportation of nursery stock. The amended rule emphasizes regulation of this pathway.

This rule is necessary to protect Vermont's hemlock resource. The amendment is necessary because hemlock woolly adelgid (HWA) was first reported in Vermont in 2007 and is now established within the state. The existing rule is an external quarantine and only prohibits entry of regulated articles into Vermont. This creates confusion about movement of hemlock from infested counties within Vermont. The amendment is necessary because the existing rule is outdated and some provisions are no longer relevant.

16. EXPLANATION OF HOW THE RULE IS NOT ARBITRARY:

The rule is no longer arbitrary because this amendment will allow the rule to target the primary means of anthropogenic dispersal in Vermont - transportation of nursery trees.

B.Nurseries: Positive impact. Nursery regulations and compliance inspections will continue under the amended rule. Most of the hemlocks sold and utilized by Vermont's ornamental horticulture industries are imported. The rule continues to place conditions on where hemlocks can be imported from but will now allow treated hemlocks to be imported. The benefit to nurseries is increased market potential and the preservation of a tree species in Vermont.

C.VAAFM: Neutral impact. VAAFM will maintain its normal role in inspecting nurseries and conducting pest delineation surveys.

D. Vermont Department of Forests, Parks and Recreation: Positive impact. Vermont Department of Forests Parks and Recreation will no longer be required to regulate this pest and will be able to dedicate resources and staff to other regulated activities.
