<u>Notes</u>

- 1. The students listed under all categories are the rounded amount from the year 2019-2020 according to the Agency of Education. About 10,000 of the students in the Universal School Meal programs are also enrolled in the "free and reduced-price" programs, so that the schools can receive federal aid accordingly. These schools have some of the highest ratios of students enrolled in the free and reduced-price programs statewide.
- 2. About 75% of schools that use the Community Eligibility Provision have more than 60% of the student body that qualify for free and reduced lunch. Therefore, the federal government provides all of the funding for these programs.
