Possible Senate Child Tax Credit Proposals

House Passed:

- \$1,200 refundable credit for each child 6 and under
- Full credit up to \$200,000 AGI for single/married taxpayers
- Phases out quickly after \$200,000
- Roughly 40,000 children receive \$1,200
- Total cost: \$48 million

Goal: \$45 million overall cost, more progressive structure than House

Idea 1: Big credit at lower incomes, longer phaseout

- \$1,350 refundable credit for taxpayers below \$25,000 AGI
- Phases out \$50 for every \$10,000 in income after that.
- Credit is \$0 by \$295,000
- Estimated 39,000 children receive some tax credit
- Total Cost: \$45.2 million

Idea 2: Big credit at lower incomes, shorter phaseout


- \$1,350 refundable credit for taxpayers below \$50,000 AGI
- Phases out \$75 for every \$10,000 in income after that.
- Credit is \$0 by \$230,000
- Estimated 33,000 receive some tax credit
- Total Cost: \$45 million

Idea 3: Even bigger credit at lower incomes, quick phaseout

- \$1,450 refundable credit for taxpayers below \$25,000 AGI
- Phases out \$90 for every \$10,000 in income after that.
- Credit is \$0 by \$186,000
- Estimated 33,000 children receive some tax credit
- Total Cost: \$45.3 million

Idea 4: Same as House, just lower income thresholds

- \$1,200 refundable credit for children 6 and under
- Full credit up to \$150,000 AGI for single/married taxpayers
- Credit is \$0 by \$174,000
- Estimated 37,500 children receive \$1,200
- Total Cost: \$44.6 million



Bonus just for reference: same as House, only a smaller credit

- \$1,125 refundable credit for each child 6 and under
- Full credit up to \$200,000 AGI for single/married taxpayers
- Phases out quickly after \$200,000
- Roughly 40,000 children receive \$1,125
- Total cost: \$45 million
