# State and Federal Broadband Subscription Subsidies

### Federal & State Lifeline

- \$9.25 credit on telephone or broadband bill for participating carriers.
- Carriers must be Eligible Telecommunications Carriers ("ETCs")
- Only 3 Wireless ETC selling in Vermont – Qlink, Tracfone, Life Wireless
- 1 Broadband only ETC Burlington Telecom
- 9,353 Vermont Subscribers (November 2020)

 State provides an additional \$4.25 subsidy for Telephone service only

# Vermont Temporary Broadband Subsidy

- Goal: Keep Vermonters facing economic hardship from losing internet service during COVID-19
- PSD allocated \$3M in CRF funding toward TBS
- Salesforce application similar to most other state CRF programs

- \$40 credit per month (\$400) (or full amount of monthly subscription, whichever is lower).
- Retroactive subsidy, March-December
- Covered subscribers of participating an non-participating ISPs.

# TBS Eligibility

#### COVID related hardship:

- 20% loss in monthly income year over year for March-June
- layoff
- Furlough
- 20% reduction in wage-hours due to COVID-19
- Reduction in work due to closure of a childcare or assisted living facility.

- COVID-19 health related impacts to self, a member of the household, or family member requiring quarantine, hospital assistance, or hospice care by the utility service account holder
- Eligibility requirements were the same for VCAAP.
- Pandemic Related Need: remote work, remote learning, telehealth

# New Federal Emergency Broadband Benefit Program

- ▶ \$3.2 Billion in funding
- Administered by the FCC and USAC
- Subsidy to begin in March
- Available to low income
  - existing Lifeline customer
  - National School Lunch Program
  - Substantial loss of income since February 29, 2020
  - Pell Grant
  - Subscriber of already established provider's low-income program

- Credit up to \$50/month (\$75 for tribal lands subscribers)
- \$100 toward a connected device
- Final rules not published
- Estimated to last 8-9 months
