9	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

11	Sec. 1. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS
12	The General Assembly finds:
13	(a) Since at least 2009 when it enacted 20 V.S.A. § 1883, the General
14	Assembly has recognized the need for the consolidation of collective law
15	enforcement resources by reducing or eliminating redundancies, enhanced
16	overall coordination and communication, an overall statewide law enforcement
17	strategic plan to improve efficiencies, and coordination on an operational level
18	to ensure cooperation and collaboration of programs funded through grants.
19	The General Assembly has been interested in the development of an integrated

1	and coordinated approach among agency law enforcement divisions with the
2	goal of creating a force multiplier to be coordinated through the State Police.
3	(b) There is a need for all agencies of State government charged with law
4	enforcement and law enforcement advisory and policy-making functions to
5	achieve meaningful law enforcement reform, modernization, and innovation.
6	(c) Meaningful law enforcement reform, modernization, and innovation can
7	be best achieved through structural re-organization of State public safety
8	assets. Re-organization will enhance service delivery and efficiency and bring
9	together policy vision and operations to accelerate innovation, modernization,
10	and cultural change.

7	(4) such other duties and law enforcement obligations as may be
8	assigned by law.
9	(c) The Agency of Public Safety shall consist of the following:
10	(1) the Department of Law Enforcement, including:
11	(A) the Division of the Vermont State Police; and
12	(B) the Division of Motor Vehicle Enforcement;
13	(2) the Department of Fire Safety and Emergency Management; and
14	(3) the Division of Support Services.
15	(d) The following units are attached to the Agency for administrative
16	support:
17	(1) Fire Service Training Council;
18	(2) Law Enforcement Advisory Board;
19	(3) State Police Advisory Commission;
20	(4) Search and Rescue Council;
21	(5) Animal Cruelty Investigation Advisory Board;

1	(6) Electricians Licensing Board;
2	(7) Elevator Safety Review Board;
3	(8) State Emergency Response Commission;
4	(9) Plumbers Examining Board;
5	(10) Council Advisory Committee;
6	(11) Vermont Criminal Justice Council; and
7	(12) Enhanced 911 Board.
8	§ 6003. ADVISORY CAPACITY
9	(a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, all boards and
10	commissions are a part of or are attached to the Agency pursuant to this
11	chapter shall be advisory only, and the powers and duties of the boards and
12	commissions, including administrative, policy-making, and regulatory
13	functions, shall vest in and be exercised by the Secretary of the Agency.

13	(9) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this chapter, the
14	divisions within the Department of Law Enforcement may not be abolished or
15	transferred.
16	<u>§ 6054. DIRECTORS</u>
17	(a) A director shall administer each division within the Agency. The
18	commissioners, with the approval of the Secretary, shall appoint the directors
19	for divisions that are part of a department, and the Secretary shall appoint any
20	other directors. Each division and its officers shall be under the direction and

1	control of the appointing authority except with regard to the quasi-judicial acts
2	or duties vested in them by law.
3	(b) No rule or policy may be issued by a director of a division without the
