task force to evaluate Vermont's response to the COVID-19 pandemic and

9	An act relating to a health emergency task force and State plan
10	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
11	Sec. 1. HEALTH EMERGENCY TASK FORCE AND STATE PLAN
12	(a)(1) On or before January 1, 2022, the Secretary of the Administration
13	shall consolidate data collected by each department and agency involved in
14	Vermont's response to the COVID-19 pandemic regarding the respective
15	department's or agency's role in responding to the pandemic. Data collected
16	by responsive departments and agencies shall include:
17	(A) policy modifications implemented in response to the COVID-19
18	pandemic, including the effectiveness and limitation of each modification;
19	(B) identification of any populations, regions, or infrastructures that
20	would have benefitted from more timely or robust State interventions, or both;

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1	(C) alternative responses and policies that would have better served
2	Vermonters;
3	(D) opportunities to prevent, mitigate, and better respond to future
4	health emergencies; and
5	(E) any other relevant information necessary to ensure that
6	Vermont's experience during the COVID-19 pandemic informs future
7	statewide health emergency responses.
8	(2) On or before September 1, 2021, responsive departments and
9	agencies shall submit all data required by subdivision (1) of this subsection to
10	the Secretary of the Administration.
11	(b) On or before September 1, 2021, the Secretary of Administration shall
12	convene a task force for the purpose of evaluating Vermont's response to the
13	COVID-19 pandemic and developing a strategic State plan for addressing
14	future statewide health emergencies.
15	(c) The task force shall be composed of the following members:
16	(1) the Secretary of Administration, who shall serve as chair;
17	(2) the Secretary of Human Services or designee;
18	(3) the Commissioner of Health or designee;
19	(4) the Commissioner for Children and Families or designee;
20	(5) the Commissioner of Disabilities, Aging, and Independent Living or
21	designee;

1	(6) the Commissioner of Vermont Health Access or designee;
2	(7) the Commissioner of Corrections or designee;
3	(8) the Commissioner of Mental Health or designee;
4	(9) the Commissioner of Public Safety or designee;
5	(10) the Secretary of Education or designee;
6	(11) the Commissioner of Labor or designee;
7	(12) the Secretary of Commerce and Community Development;
8	(13) the Secretary of State or designee; and
9	(14) any other persons the Secretary of Administration believes would
10	be helpful in carrying out the task force's charge.
11	(d)(1) The task force shall review and use data submitted pursuant to
12	subsection (a) of this section to create a strategic State plan for addressing
13	future statewide health emergencies that may arise. On or before February 15,
14	2022, the task force shall submit a proposed strategic State plan to the General
15	Assembly, highlighting any legislative changes necessary to implement a final
16	strategic State plan. The proposed strategic State plan shall address ongoing
17	State and local hazard mitigation planning efforts.
18	(2) On or before July 1, 2022, after soliciting input from the relevant
19	subject matter committees of the General Assembly, the task force shall adopt
