Consultation regarding diagnosis and treatment of Alzheimer's Disease is now available by appointment for primary care providers in Vermont. This work is supported by a grant from DAIL.

If you would like to discuss a dementia clinical issue with Dr. Pendlebury, sign up for up to 45-minutes for a consult. Click the link below to pick a date.

Dr. Pendlebury will be available on the second and fourth Wednesdays of the month from 2:00-4:00 pm (May 2021 to June 2022) for ad hoc/informal consultation to discuss clinical issues concerning Alzheimer's disease and related disorders.

- These consultations can take the form of Q & A sessions, discussion of interesting or problematic clinical cases, pharmacologic treatment, or review of specific clinical or research topics.
- There will be no fee for these consultations, and the specific topic(s) will be chosen in advance by the primary care provider (PCP) requesting the consultation.
- Each session will last no more than 45 minutes and will be available to PCPs throughout the State of Vermont.
- The format will be via video through Zoom and you will be sent a link when you sign up.
