12	ancestry, age, service in the U.S. Armed Forces, disability as defined by 21
13	V.S.A. § 495d(5), sexual orientation, or gender identity protected characteristic
14	shall be subject to the following penalties:

16	(b) The victim's actual or perceived protected characteristic or
17	characteristics as provided in subsection (a) of this section need not be a
18	substantial, predominant, or the sole reason for defendant's conduct.
19	(c) As used in this section, "protected characteristic" means a person's race,

color, religion, national origin, sex, ancestry, age, service in the U.S. Armed

1	Forces or the National Guard, disability as defined by 21 V.S.A. § 495d(5),
2	sexual orientation, or gender identity.
3	Sec. 2. 13 V.S.A. § 1456 is amended to read:
4	§ 1456. BURNING OF CROSS OR OTHER RELIGIOUS SYMBOL
5	Any person who intentionally and maliciously sets fire to, or burns, causes
6	to be burned, or aids or procures the burning of a cross or a religious symbol,
7	with the intention of terrorizing or harassing a particular person or persons,
8	shall be subject to a term of imprisonment of not more than two years or a fine
9	of not more than \$5,000.00, or both.
10	Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE
11	This act shall take effect on passage.
