Re: Support for S. 126

Dear Chair Bray and Committee Members:

On behalf of the Consumer Technology Association (CTA), thank you for opportunity to provide comments outlining our support for S. 126, a bill to modernize the 100% manufacturer-funded Vermont Electronics Recycling Program. The primary change in this bill is to shift some administrative responsibilities currently under DEC to the manufacturers of electronics who pay for the recycling program.

CTA is the trade association representing the U.S. consumer technology industry. Eighty percent of CTA's nearly 2,000 member companies are small businesses and startups; others are among the world's best-known manufacturing and retail brands of consumer electronics including televisions and computers. Our member companies have long been recognized for their commitment and leadership in innovation and sustainability.

What the Bill Does

This legislation shifts several administrative functions to a "manufacturer clearinghouse" which is our industry's version of a Producer Responsibility Organization (PRO). The bill also maintains very active regulatory oversight of the recycling program with annual plan approval required by the Department of Environmental Conservation.

There are also two important program updates that were not included when this program was enacted a decade ago. First, it incorporates incentives for improved new product design/environmental performance. Second, it directs the Department to minimize greenhouse gas emissions when reviewing the annual plan.

What the Bill Does Not Do

The bill does not reduce collection opportunities provided to Vermont residents. Nor does it change the producer-paid financing model, the manufacturer registration fees paid to the

Department, program recycling standards, the scope of electronics covered in the program, nor who in Vermont is eligible to receive recycling services provided by the program.
