- Over \$2.6 billion in energy cost savings
- Over **12 million** metric tons of CO₂e
- Robust efficiency workforce

Oversight & regulation overview

- The regulatory process helps focus the investment that Vermonters make in efficiency and prioritize benefits to Vermonters
- Measures are evaluated to ensure a balanced, cost-effective portfolio of programs to benefit all Vermonters
- Once budgets are approved, programs are implemented statewide to serve customers, support the workforce, and meet the established goals
- If budgets increase, administrative costs do not increase at the same rate

Regulatory oversight for effective program delivery

Each piece of the budgeting and program implementation process helps ensure we are maximizing resources and prioritizing benefits to Vermonters.

Three-year budgets & goals are approved by PUC in the Demand Resources Plan proceeding

Budgets are updated and reviewed annually with PUC through Triennial Plan

Significant program changes and new programs are reviewed by DPS quarterly

Maximizing resources and prioritizing benefits to Vermonters – balancing the portfolio.

Regulatory oversight for effective program delivery

Ensuring a balanced cost-effective portfolio of programs to benefit all Vermonters

- Efficiency measures with proven savings and customer benefit are made available statewide
- New technologies are incentivized to provide compelling customer economics
- Rigorous annual evaluation and savings verification process ensures that benefits are real and durable



Implementing statewide programs

What goes into a program once the budget is set?

- Program design and implementation
 - Over 50 active programs for businesses and residential customers
 - Work with VGS, BED, Weatherization Agencies, 3E, DUs, and more to design effective statewide programs
- Outreach and education
 - Working with partners to educate Vermonters about the benefits of energy efficiency
 - 337,737 visitors to efficiencyvermont.com in 2020 and 245,370 newsletters sent
- Customer support
 - Answering calls and emails from customers and connecting them to resources
 - 31,137 customer contacts handled in 2020
- Processing rebates
 - 9,500 projects processed in 2020 across all funders
- Evaluation, measurement, and verification
 - Analyzing energy savings to ensure performance
 - 96.4-101.5% realization rate in the last three years

Case study: workforce development

Ongoing efforts to grow the workforce and help Vermonters connect with trade partners

- The Efficiency Excellence Network (EEN) offers support in exchange for maintaining necessary certifications
- Ongoing trainings switched to virtual training platform to support contractors during shutdown

Building Performance Institute (BPI) Certification trainings

- Five trainings in 2019-2020 at VTC: 44 total participants
- Provided a stipend for attendance to compensate for time, with a bonus when certified
- Efficiency Vermont staff designed and led trainings
- Paused for COVID with plans to resume in 2021

New partnership with Neighborworks of Western Vermont to act as general contractor
