**Subject:** Vermont State Auditor's Office FY23 Budget Submission

The Governor's proposed FY23 budget for the State Auditor's Office (SAO) reflects modest changes from our FY22 budget. Changes of note include:

1. Reduction in expected auditing costs by CLA, the firm the SAO contracts with to complete the Single Audit and the ACFR.

- 2. FY22 budget included a 27<sup>th</sup> pay period that the SAO's internal service fund, the Single Audit Revolving Fund (SARF), covered. This is not necessary in FY23.
- 3. Increased employee compensation primarily due to health insurance changes, retirement contributions, filling vacancies, and recruitment. The SAO's office anticipates full staffing for the entirety of FY23.

#### **Request: Conversion of Position to Senior Auditor**

Throughout CY2021, the SAO tried unsuccessfully to fill a vacant Staff Auditor II position. This stands in contrast to recent recruitment efforts to fill vacant Senior Auditor positions. Since the beginning of COVID, we have successfully filled three Senior Auditor positions with extremely talented auditors who have brought significant and varied auditing experience to the SAO. The national pool of qualified auditors appears to have a donut hole – there is a supply of inexperienced auditors who don't rise to the level required of a Staff Auditor II position, and there is a supply of extremely experienced auditors who exceed the qualifications and expected salary range of a Staff Auditor II, but there doesn't seem to be a supply of quality applicants who are quite the right fit. As a result, we sought and received permission to convert one Staff Auditor II position into a Senior Auditor position. *Therefore, the SAO is requesting an additional \$70,000 in SARF authority to fund the additional expense associated with this conversion.* 

#### State Auditor's Office FY22 Highlights-To-Date

#### **Performance Audits**

All-Payer ACO Model Implementation Costs: DVHA reports show that OneCare missed financial targets for 2017 through 2019 by a combined \$11.1 million. During those same years DVHA also paid \$14.5 million of OneCare's operating costs. When including the operating costs, OneCare's estimated net Medicaid financial performance for those years collectively is -\$25.6 million.

<u>COVID-19 Emergency Economic Recovery Grant Program: Agency of Commerce and Community Development</u>: Some ineligible businesses received awards, and Round 2.0 awards increased profitability for many of the

Some ineligible businesses received awards, and Round 2.0 awards increased profitability for many of the businesses reviewed instead of redressing financial harm. In addition, despite being alerted to a design flaw in Round 1 that allowed applicants to receive awards that exceeded their COVID-related losses, ACCD did not change course in Round 2, putting even more dollars at risk of recapture by the federal government. ACCD responded to the audit's findings that it lacked sufficient controls to prevent ineligible businesses from receiving awards, or from receiving more than permitted under federal law, by writing a letter expressing that it was vital to help businesses in 2020 (the audit didn't suggest otherwise). ACCD did not address the audit's findings.

<u>Tax Increment Financing District: Barre City</u>: Barre City managed its TIF district in accordance with requirements, except too little tax increment was retained and too much was paid to the school district. Both H.508 and S.169 seek to address the latter issue.

<u>Department of Environmental Conservation's Dam Safety Program</u>: Some high and significant hazard dams, including state-owned dams, linger in poor condition for many years. Failure of these dams could result in the loss of life or significant property damage. Inspections are not being conducted on schedule, and recommended repairs are often ignored by dam owners. DEC cites low staffing authorization as one reason for these findings

(Coming soon) *COVID-19 Health Care Provider Stabilization Grant Program: Agency of Human Services*: This report complements the ERG audit, with insights into how the State distributed three rounds of grants to health care providers. The program's initial appropriation was \$173M.

#### **Investigative Reports**

Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act: What is Vermont Achieving with WIOA Title I and Title III Funding: This cornerstone of Vermont's workforce development efforts serves relatively few eligible Vermonters, and many Adult participants have no earnings or report earnings of less than \$4999 two quarters after exiting WIOA programming. We find that more proactive outreach could boost participation, participants who receive training through WIOA have higher employment and earnings than those who only receive career services, and VDOL

<u>Strategies to Control the Rising Cost of State Employee Health Care: Examining Price Variation in the State Employee Health Plan</u>: Implementing a reference-based pricing system could save \$16M per year without any negative impact on state employees.

does not have a system for receiving participant feedback to improve service delivery.

Measuring Up: Examining Performance Reporting in the Vermont Annual Outcomes Report: The Annual Outcomes Report provides limited use for judging government performance since most population-level outcomes are impacted by forces larger than state government. Many indicators need to be improved or replaced. The report provides a new set of tools to assist the GAC and CPO in this work.

**Single Audit and Annual Comprehensive Financial Report**: The <u>Single Audit</u> and <u>ACFR</u> were both completed by our contractor, CliftonLarsonAllen LLP, on time. The links will take you to the full documents.

<u>Department of Labor 1099 Release</u> and <u>Protection of Personally Identifiable Information</u> (forthcoming): At the request of Governor Scott, our office oversaw a two-part audit of the Department of Labor. The first report, released in April, identified the cause of the release of thousands of 1099s to incorrect recipients as a manual error committed by one staff person at Labor. The second audit, which will be released this week, makes recommendations regarding the protections of Personally Identifiable Information (PII).
