## What is a Credential of Value (COV)?



- → Certificate, degree, industry recognized credential, occupational license, or registered apprenticeship
- → A means of verifying skills and competencies
- → Has value in current and/or future labor market
- → Stackable, transferable




When students have the support to connect their education to a career, they are more likely to say their education will be worth the cost.






## **Vermonters Need Navigation Help**
