Good afternoon Senator Campion,

Here are a few links (below) to get the Committee started. I'm happy to come back at another time and I will follow up when I get a sense from my data colleagues their capacity to engage in the type of analysis that would be necessary to make an informed decision. Even engaging an outside entity would require tapping our data team. It's a common misconception that it saves us energy (appreciate the sentiment) but in fact it frequently means filling external entities data requests - particularly when they need to track student records versus what we put on the dashboard for the public -- because they need access to protected data. This then means that we're doing the analysis, data governance, data-sharing agreements and then working with an external entity to help them understand the data so they can use it appropriately. This often means greater demand on the data team rather than less. Just a factor to consider.
