4	respectfully reports that it has considered the same and recommends that the
5	bill be amended by striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in
6	lieu thereof the following:
7	Sec. 1. 2 V.S.A. chapter 19 is amended to read:
8	CHAPTER 19. LEGISLATIVE ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON THE
9	STATE HOUSE
10	§ 651. LEGISLATIVE ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON THE STATE
11	HOUSE
12	(a) The Legislative Advisory Committee on the State House is created.
13	(b) The Committee shall be composed of 13 12 members:
14	(1) four three members of the House of Representatives, appointed
15	biennially by the Speaker of the House;
16	(2) four three members of the Senate, appointed biennially by the
17	Committee on Committees;
18	(3) the Chair of the Board of Trustees of the Friends of the Vermont
19	State House;
20	(4) the Director of the Vermont Historical Society;
21	(5) the Director of the Vermont Council on the Arts;

1	(6) the Commissioner of Buildings and General Services or designee;
2	and
3	(7) the State Curator; and
4	(8) the Sergeant at Arms.
5	(c) The Committee shall biennially elect a chair from among its legislative
6	members. A quorum shall consist of seven members.
7	(d) The Committee shall meet at the State House at least one time when the
8	General Assembly is in session and at least one time when the General
9	Assembly is not in session or at the call of the Chair. The Commissioner of
10	Buildings and General Services shall keep minutes of the meetings and
11	maintain a file thereof.
12	(e) The Committee shall have the assistance of the Office of Legislative
13	Counsel and the Office of Legislative Operations.
14	§ 652. PER DIEM AND EXPENSES; LEGISLATIVE MEMBERS
15	For meetings held during adjournment of the General Assembly, the
16	legislative members of the Committee shall be entitled to per diem
17	compensation and expense reimbursement as provided in subsection 406(a) of
18	this title.
19	§ 653. FUNCTIONS
20	(a)(1) The Legislative Advisory Committee on the State House shall be
21	consulted on oversee all activities relating to the acquisition collections and

1	care of paintings and historic artifacts and furnishings, and shall be consulted
2	on the refurbishing, renovation, preservation, and expansion of the building
3	and its interior.
4	(2) The Legislative Advisory Committee on the State House shall
5	develop approve a plan for the acquisition collections or commission of
6	artwork for the State House collection that represents Vermont's diverse
7	people and history, including diversity of gender, race, ethnicity, sexuality, and
8	disability status.
9	(b) The Sergeant at Arms and the Commissioner of Buildings and General
10	Services, in discharging responsibilities under subdivision 62(a)(6) of this title
11	and 29 V.S.A. §§ 154(a) and 154a, respectively, shall consider the
12	recommendations of the Committee. The Committee's recommendations shall
13	be advisory only.
14	(c)(1) The Committee may establish permanent or ad hoc subcommittees as
15	needed to carry out its duties.
16	(2) A collections subcommittee of the Committee shall, in coordination
17	with experts, develop a collections policy for recommendation to the
18	Committee.
19	(d) The Chair of the Committee, the Sergeant at Arms, the State Curator,
20	and the President of the Friends of the Vermont State House shall execute a

1	memorandum of understanding to coordinate the policies, oversight, and care
2	of the State House artwork collection.
3	Sec. 2. 2 V.S.A. § 62 is amended to read:
4	§ 62. LEGISLATIVE DUTIES
5	(a) The Sergeant at Arms shall:
6	(1) execute orders of either house, the Joint Legislative Management
7	Committee, the Committee on Joint Rules, or the House or Senate Committee
8	on Rules;
9	(2) maintain order among spectators and take measures to prevent
10	interruption of either house or any committee thereof;
11	(3) arrange for special meetings and conferences at the State House;
12	(4) provide for the distribution of mail to all legislators;
13	(5) schedule the time for the use of rooms for committee meetings and
14	hearings;
15	(6) maintain the State House and its furnishings in a good state of repair
16	and provide security for all furniture, draperies, rugs, desks, and other
17	furnishings kept in the State House, in consultation with the State Curator;
18	(7) provide for the establishment of a cafeteria and supervise its
19	operation;
20	(8) provide security for the State House, pursuant to the responsibilities
21	set forth in 29 V.S.A. § 171; and

1	(9) perform such other duties for the benefit of the legislators as may be
2	required by any duly authorized committee thereof.
3	(b) He or she or any person in his or her employ shall not accept any
4	compensation or gift for his or her services other than his or her salary. If he
5	or she or any person in his or her employ violates this provision, he or she shall
6	be fined \$25.00.
7	(c) The Sergeant at Arms shall not be responsible for structural repairs,
8	capital improvements, or building for maintenance for the or curating the
9	historic State House and its collections (as the term maintenance is defined in
10	29 V.S.A. § 159) or for the use, upkeep, or maintenance of the State House
11	grounds.
12	(d) The Sergeant at Arms and employees of the Sergeant at Arms shall seek
13	guidance from and operate in accordance with policies adopted by the Joint
14	Legislative Management Committee.
15	Sec. 3. 29 V.S.A. § 154a is amended to read:
16	§ 154a. STATE CURATOR
17	(a) Creation. The position of State Curator is created within the
18	Department of Buildings and General Services.
19	(b) Duties. The State Curator's responsibilities shall include:

1	(1) oversight of the general historic preservation of the State House,
2	including maintaining the historical integrity of the State House and works of
3	art in the State House its collections of art, decorative arts, and furnishings;
4	(2) interpretation of the State House to the visiting public through
5	exhibits, publications, and tours, and other means of communication; and
6	(3) acquisition, management, and care of State collections of art and
7	historic furnishings, provided that any works of art for the State House are
8	acquired pursuant to the requirements of 2 V.S.A. § 653(a); and
9	(4) oversight and management of the State's historic and contemporary
10	art and collections in State buildings and on State property.
11	(c) Acquisition Collections policy. In coordination with the Legislative
12	Advisory Committee on the State House, and in accordance with the plan
13	developed pursuant to 2 V.S.A. § 653, and upon approval of the Legislative
14	Advisory Committee on the State House, the State Curator shall adopt an
15	acquisition a collections policy that ensures that the acquisition of art for the
16	State House reflects a diversity of artistic media and artists, and celebrates the
17	natural history of the State, and the diversity of the people and stories of
18	Vermont throughout the history of the State.
19	(d) Interpretive plan. In coordination with the Friends of the Vermont State
20	House and the Vermont Historical Society, the State Curator shall create an
21	interpretive plan that tells the stories of the State House art collection through

1	accessible written, multimedia, and oral means. The plan shall include
2	appropriate and inclusive training of State House volunteers and staff.
3	Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE
4	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.
