14	In fiscal year 2023, the General Assembly shall appropriate \$1,200,000.00

16	expanding the Vermont Suicide Prevention Center's Zero Suicide program and
17	other comprehensive suicide prevention initiatives to engage a statewide
18	coalition with broad public and private sector representation and build
19	coalition partner capacity to assist in suicide prevention planning,
20	implementation, and evaluation that includes:
21	(1) expanding the Zero Suicide program through workforce
