Q14 How long have you lived in Windsor

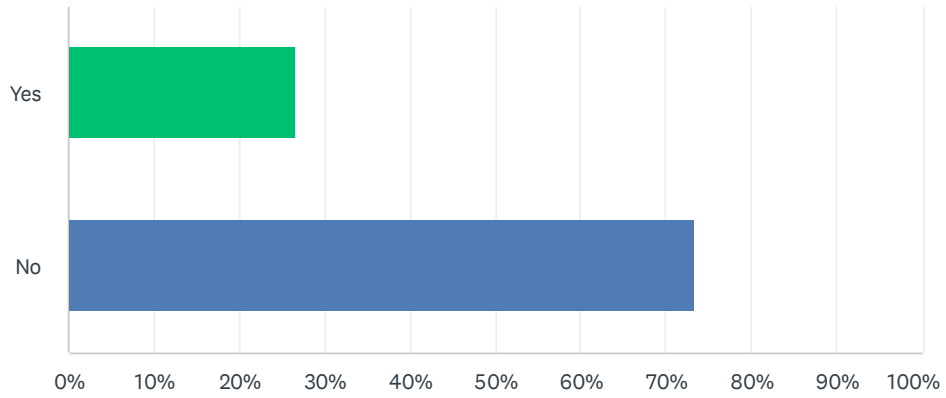
