Dear Legislators:

Last session, I presented to you a two-year Capital Budget proposal consistent with the recommendations from the Capital Debt Affordability Committee. By utilizing reallocations and our bonding capacity, we were able to advance a total of \$127,378,694 in capital projects. This year I present you a Capital Budget Adjustment of \$14,114,757. This proposal continues to focus on protecting our most vulnerable and rebuilding and strengthening our economy, while reducing our dependency on borrowing.

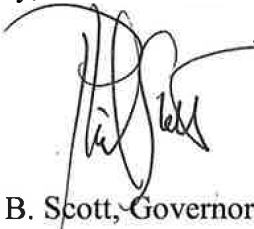
As I mentioned in my State of the State address, we must continue to address our demographic crisis by growing our economy and our labor force. To that end, my proposal includes \$1,660,000 in funding for the renovation and modernization of the Vermont Building at the Eastern State Exposition. The Vermont Building showcases the authenticity, quality, and spirit of Vermont through companies throughout our State which share their products which millions of fair goers each year.

Clean water is critical to our economic prosperity and our way of life. Clean water protects our public health, supports fishing, swimming, boating, and other recreational uses; and provides critical wildlife habitat. Clean water attracts many visitors to our wonderful state. Therefore, my proposal follows the recommendations of the Clean Water Board and strategically allocates \$11,000,000. Further, my proposal includes an additional \$2.8 million to be used as match for more than \$26.7 million in federal funding being made available to Vermont by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency under the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) for the state revolving loan fund. In general, the IIJA monies can be made available to borrowers as 49% subsidy, meaning this funding will be quite attractive to municipalities that need to repair, refurbish, or upgrade existing water infrastructure.

Additionally, increases to needed investments in our State-owned buildings and facilities are proposed, including improvements to our HVAC infrastructure in the Statehouse, the Secure Psychiatric Recovery Residence, completing necessary ADA compliance upgrades to our correctional facilities and completing the Williston Public Safety Field Station.

I look forward to working with you on these proposals this session.

Public Service Department – Critical Communications Expansion Program \$51,500,000.00

*These funds would support the deployment of at least 100 new mobile wireless installations to improve service along state highways and in population centers. This would ensure uniform coverage along the interstate corridors from one or more of the three nationwide cellular carriers.*

Libraries Capital Project \$15,900,000.00

*These funds will pay for capital improvements such as ADA compliance, better space for in-building internet access, including private or semi-private space for online medical appointments and job interviews, and general building improvements. These funds would be sub-granted to libraries based on proposals submitted to the Department of Libraries.*

Agency of Natural Resources (ANR) Community Centers \$44,069,184.00

*These funds will create a grant program for investment in infrastructure improvements to community public facilities. The grants will give communities an opportunity to improve existing space to allow for safe public gatherings including but not limited to community public health needs, emergency management, and community engagement for vulnerable populations. Building investments would focus on improvements such as HVAC, air quality, weatherization, electric efficiency, EV infrastructure, broadband access, solar power, etc. Maximum grant of \$1M for approximately 44 grant awards.*

ANR Department of Forests Parks and Recreation – Parks Connectivity Project \$1,530,816.00

*This project will improve reliability, performance, and support of internet connectivity services to all state parks. Currently, connectivity speeds and reliability vary greatly across Vermont's 55 state parks. In some cases, performance is poor enough that the state parks online reservation system does not perform adequately hindering, park operations. The Department and ADS propose to work with a contractor to improve internet connectivity services and ensure that reliable internet service is provided at all parks for proper functioning of the parks reservation software and to improve services for the visiting public and park employees.*

On or before December 15, 2021, the Commissioner of Finance and Management shall review and recommend water and sewer infrastructure projects funded in fiscal year 2022 that could be funded with ARPA funds to the Chairs of the House Committee on Corrections and Institutions and the Senate Committee on Institutions and to the Governor for the fiscal years 2022–2023 capital budget adjustment report"
