8	§ 3701. PROHIBITION ON CIVIL ARREST AT COURTHOUSES		
9	(a) Prohibition. Any person or family or household member of the person		
10	who is attending a court proceeding in good faith as a party, juror, attorney, or		
11	witness shall be privileged from civil arrest while traveling to, entering,		
12	remaining at, or returning from the court proceeding.		
13	(b) Exceptions. Subsection (a) of this section shall not apply to:		
14	(1) an arrest pursuant to a judicially issued warrant or a court order;		
15	(2) an arrest for contempt of the court where the proceeding is		
16	occurring; or		
17	(3) an arrest to maintain order or safety in the court where the		
18	proceeding is occurring.		
19	(c) Penalties. Remedies.		
20	(1) A person who violates this section by executing or assisting with an		
21	arrest prohibited by subsection (a) of this section shall be subject to civil		

1	contempt proceedings pursuant to 12 V.S.A. chapter 5 and may be liable in a
2	civil action for false imprisonment in an action brought under subsection (d) of
3	this section.
4	(d) Private right of action.
5	(2) A person who is arrested in violation of subsection (a) of this section
6	may bring a civil action in the Civil Division of the Superior Court against the
7	violator for damages, injunctive, equitable, or declaratory relief, punitive
8	damages in the case of a willful violation, and reasonable costs and attorney's
9	<u>fees.</u>
10	(3) The Office of the Attorney General may bring a civil action under
11	subdivision (1) of this subsection on behalf of the State of Vermont for
12	appropriate injunctive, equitable, or declaratory relief if there is reasonable
13	cause to believe that a violation of subsection (a) of this section has occurred
14	or will occur.
15	(4) No action under this subsection shall be brought against the
16	Judiciary or any of its members or employees for actions taken to maintain
17	order or safety in the courts.
18	(e) Definitions. As used in this section:
19	(1) "Civil arrest" means an arrest for purposes of obtaining a person's
20	presence or attendance at a civil proceeding, including an immigration
21	proceeding.

1	(2) "Household member" has the sam	te meaning as in 15 V.S.A. § 1101.
