- (a) A write-in candidate shall not qualify as a primary winner unless he or she the candidate receives at least one-half the same number of votes as the number of signatures required for his or her the candidate's office on a primary petition, except that if a write-in candidate receives more votes than a any other candidate whose name is printed on the ballot, he or she the write-in candidate may qualify as a primary winner.
