19	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to enact several
20	measures related to firearms. The bill proposes:
21	(1) the following requirements related to firearms storage:

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alcohol is licensed to be served; and

1	(A) to require that, when a firearm is not in a person's immediate
2	possession or control, the firearm must be properly secured in such a way to
3	render it inoperable by any person other than the owner or other lawfully
4	authorized user and stored separately from ammunition and to set forth
5	escalating penalties for violation of this provision based on the severity of the
6	harm resulting from not properly securing a firearm as required by law;
7	(B) to require federally licensed firearms dealers to post a sign in the
8	dealer's place of business that states the requirements for firearms storage
9	under Vermont law and to provide firearms purchasers with written materials
10	at the time of purchase that contain guidance for safe firearms storage;
11	(C) to impose criminal and civil liability on a person who violates
12	Vermont safe storage requirements with respect to a firearm that is
13	subsequently used to injure or kill another person; and
14	(D) to make an appropriation for fiscal year 2024 that provides short-
15	term funding to help Vermonters purchase safes, depositories, and other
16	equipment for secure firearms storage;
