13	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to allow
14	municipalities to seasonally install in-street pedestrian crossing signs in
15	crosswalks, allow municipalities to lower certain speed limits on State
16	highways, and express the General Assembly's intent that the Traffic
17	Committee should not increase the speed limit on a State highway in response
18	to a municipality's request that the speed limit be lowered.

1	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

3	Sec. 1. 23 V.S.A. § 1030 is added to read:
4	<u>§ 1030. IN-STREET PEDESTRIAN CROSSING SIGNS</u>
5	Notwithstanding 19 V.S.A. § 1111, municipalities may install in-street
6	pedestrian crossing signs in nonsignalized crosswalks on State and town
7	highways. In-street pedestrian crossing signs may continuously remain in
8	crosswalks from May 1 until October 15.

10	Sec. 2. 23 V.S.A. § 1007(b) is amended to read:
11	(b)(1) The legislative body of a city municipality may establish, on the
12	basis of an engineering and traffic investigation, a speed limit on all or a part
13	of any State highway, other than a limited access highway, within its
14	jurisdiction , which that:
15	(1)(A) is not more than 50 miles per hour; or
16	(2)(B) is not less than 25 miles per hour.

5	It is the intent of the General Assembly that when the Traffic Committee
6	receives a request from a municipality to have the speed limit on a State
7	highway, other than a limited access highway, within that municipality
8	lowered that the Traffic Committee does not subsequently increase the speed
9	limit in question even if the engineering and traffic investigation indicates that
10	the speed limit could safely be increased. The speed limit in question should
11	only be increased if the engineering and traffic investigation indicates that not
12	doing so will create a greater safety hazard for the traveling public.
