7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to make various
8	amendments to the Art in State Buildings Program.
9	An act relating to the Art in State Buildings Program
10	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
11	Sec. 1. 29 V.S.A. chapter 2 is amended to read:
12	CHAPTER 2. ART IN STATE BUILDINGS
13	§ 41. ART IN STATE BUILDINGS; PURPOSE; ESTABLISHMENT
14	(a) Purpose. The State of Vermont, recognizing the need to enhance
15	recognizes that public art enhances the working environment, to improve:
16	improves the character and quality of State buildings in order to create an
17	environment of distinction, enjoyment, and pride for all citizens, and to
18	encourage the donation of works of art to the State for its permanent collection
19	or for exhibition in State buildings or facilities;, hereby establishes a program;

1	adds value to the cultural, aesthetic, and economic vitality of the State, and
2	contributes to the State's identity.
3	(b) Establishment. The Art in State Buildings Program is hereby
4	established to provide funds for and authorize the purchase, design,
5	commission, fabrication, installation, and integration of permanent works of art
6	at the time of new construction or renovation of State buildings and other
7	facilities and the maintenance and conservation of art commissioned under the
8	Program.
9	§ 42. DEFINITIONS
10	Unless the context specifically indicates otherwise, as used in this chapter,
11	the following definitions shall apply:
12	* * *
13	(8) "State building or facility" means any State building, facility,
14	permanent structure, park, or appurtenant structure thereof, wholly or partially
15	enclosed, owned or leased by State government, the University of Vermont and
16	State Agricultural College, or Vermont State Colleges, that is to be constructed
17	or renovated in part or totally with funds from any appropriation of the General
18	Assembly. The term does not include highways, airport runways, or taxi ways,
19	hangars, railroad tracks, sidings or yards, garages, sheds, warehouses, heating
20	plants, sewers, parking lots and parking garages, bridges, highway garages,
21	correctional facilities, or buildings used for storage or that are of a temporary

1	nature. The term does not include buildings or facilities owned by units of
2	local government, including school districts.
3	(9) "Project site" means any State building or facility undergoing new
4	construction or renovation with a total project cost of \$1,000,000.00 or more
5	that has been approved recommended for consideration by the Commissioner
6	pursuant to this chapter.

8	§ 43. ART ACQUISITION FUND
9	(a) An Art Acquisition Fund is created to finance the design, construction,
10	integration, and purchase or commissioning of works of art to be included as
11	an integral part of the structure of State buildings and facilities under the Art in
12	State Buildings Program. Such works of art may be attached to the structure or
13	may be detached within or outside the structure.
14	(b) Amounts in the Art Acquisition Fund at the end of each fiscal year shall
15	not revert to the General Fund.
16	(c) Amounts in the Fund shall be expended upon order of the Council for
17	acquisition or commissioning of works of art and for administration, as
18	provided in this chapter.
19	§ 44. FUNDS TRANSFER FOR ART
20	(a) The Commissioner of Buildings and General Services, with the
21	approval of the Secretary of Administration, may shall transfer up to

1	\$50,000.00 not less than \$75,000.00 in any single fiscal year to the Art
2	Acquisition Fund, from capital funds appropriated for projects which that are
3	eligible for the installation of works of art under this chapter. The
4	Commissioner shall include in the proposed annual capital budget request for
5	the Department of Buildings and General Services, as described in 32 V.S.A.
6	§ 310, a separate line item for the Art Acquisition Fund.
7	(b) Of the funds transferred under subsection (a) of this section, $\frac{5,000.00}{100}$
8	not more than 15 percent shall be available for use by the Council for the
9	expenses of administering this chapter.
10	(c) Funds may be transferred under this section without further approval or
11	appropriation by the General Assembly.
12	§ 44a. POWERS AND DUTIES OF COMMISSIONER
13	(a) The Commissioner shall:
14	(1) Advise <u>advise</u> the Council on the administration of this chapter-:
15	(2) Approve up to two recommend project sites per year for
16	consideration under this chapter for the installation of artwork-:
17	(3) Establish establish procedures for accepting the donation to the State
18	of artwork for installation in State buildings or facilities-;
19	(4) Establish establish procedures for communicating with artists
20	interested in donating artwork to the State under the provisions of this chapter-:
21	(5) Review review the final installation and placement of artwork-;

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1	(6) Assist assist occupants and contracting agencies in locating liability
2	insurance for artwork when necessary-: and
3	(7) Ensure ensure that early in the building design phase, the architect
4	will discuss the placement and form of artwork with the selected artist, and that
5	bid specifications will inform potential contractors of the artwork to be
6	installed in the building or facility.
7	(b) The Commissioner is authorized to purchase artwork for the permanent
8	State House collection with funds appropriated to the Department for that or
9	other purposes in any capital construction act.

11	§ 46. USE OF FUNDS
12	(a) Project sites that are funded from an appropriation or appropriations in
12 13	(a) Project sites that are funded from an appropriation or appropriations in one or more annual capital construction acts, shall be eligible for consideration
13	one or more annual capital construction acts, shall be eligible for consideration
13 14	one or more annual capital construction acts, shall be eligible for consideration by the advisory committee for the installation of one or more permanent works

1	(b) Priority in acquisitions and commissions of works of art shall be given
2	to Vermont artists.
3	(c) Funds transferred to the Art Acquisition Fund for the Art in State
4	Buildings Program shall not be used for the following:
5	(1) necessary site preparation such as wall or ground preparation to
6	receive the works of art, including standard lighting and structural footings;
7	and
8	(2) any decorative or landscape elements peripheral to the artworks
9	themselves and any services such as water, electricity, or lighting that are
10	needed to activate the artwork.
11	§ 47. ADVISORY COMMITTEE
12	(a) There is established an advisory committee the Art in State Buildings
13	Advisory Committee to oversee the administration of the Art Acquisition
14	Fund.
15	(b) The advisory committee Advisory Committee shall consist of the
16	following or a designee:
17	(1) the Commissioner, of Buildings and General Services;
18	(2) the director Director of the Arts Council;
19	(3) the Chairs of the House Committee on Corrections and Institutions
20	and the Senate Committee on Institutions;
21	(4) the State Curator; and

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1	(5) the Chair of the Vermont Board of Architects. Legislative members
2	of the committee shall be entitled to per diem compensation and expense
3	reimbursement for attending committee meetings pursuant to the provisions of
4	<del>2 V.S.A. § 23.</del>
5	(c) The committee Committee shall:
6	(1) oversee the administration of this chapter;
7	(2) establish guidelines for the selection, acquisition, and commission of
8	works of art; and
9	(3) establish guidelines for the composition of the art selection panel.
10	(d) Legislative members of the committee shall be entitled to per diem
11	compensation and expense reimbursement for attending Committee meetings
12	pursuant to the provisions of 2 V.S.A. § 23.
13	(e) The selection of works of art to be installed under this chapter in
14	facilities of the University of Vermont and State Agricultural College and of
15	the Vermont State Colleges shall be made pursuant to procedures of these
16	institutions for this purpose.
17	§ 48. POWERS AND DUTIES OF COUNCIL
18	(a) The Council shall facilitate a process that will result in a
19	recommendation of an artist or artist team for each project selected for
20	installation of artwork. The artist or artist team shall collaborate with the
21	project architect or design team during the initial design phase of the project.

1	(b) Following design of the project, the Council shall:
2	(1) Appoint persons to serve on the art selection panel.
3	(2) Establish contract procedures for contracting commissioning with
4	artists for the design and creation of works of art and with architects for
5	services related to the planning for the acquisition and commission of works of
6	art.
7	(3) On the advice of the art selection panel, arrange contracts with artists
8	and order payments from the art acquisition fund Art Acquisition Fund for
9	such works of art.
10	(4) Review the final installation and placement of works of art. In the
11	case of works to be commissioned, the art selection panel shall review the
12	design, the final execution, and the placement of the commissioned work.
13	(5) Assist occupant and contracting agencies in locating insurance when
14	it deems such insurance is necessary for the protection of the works of art that
15	are purchased. [Repealed.]
16	(c) Without further appropriation, the Council may expend funds
17	transferred to it for administration of this chapter.
18	Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE
19	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
