5	Subject: Legislature; salaries and fees; health insurance; life insurance;
6	retirees; State employees; legislator compensation and benefits
7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to make
8	members of the General Assembly eligible for the State employees health
9	benefit plan, with the General Assembly paying 80 percent of the premium and
10	members paying 20 percent. It would make members of the General Assembly
11	eligible for \$15,000.00 in term life insurance while in office, with the General
12	Assembly paying 75 percent of the premium and members paying 25 percent,
13	and it would increase the amount of the life insurance benefit for retired State
14	employees from \$10,000.00 to \$15,000.00. The bill would also provide
15	compensation to members of the General Assembly during adjournment in an
16	amount equal to 10 percent of their weekly salary during the legislative
17	session.

1	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

4	(a) As provided under section 631 of this title, a member who is insured by
5	the respective group insurance plans immediately preceding the member's
6	effective date of retirement shall be entitled to continuation of group insurance
7	as follows:

9	(2) members who have completed 20 years of creditable service at their
10	effective date of retirement shall be entitled to the continuation of life
11	insurance in the amount of \$10,000.00 \$15,000.00.

17	(a)(1) The Secretary of Administration may contract on behalf of the State
18	with any insurance company or nonprofit association doing business in this
19	State to secure the benefits of franchise or group insurance. Beginning on
20	July 1, 1978, the terms of coverage under the policy shall be determined under

section 904 of this title, but it may include:

(2)(A)(i) As used in this section, the term "employees" includes any
class or classes of elected or appointed officials, State's Attorneys, sheriffs,
employees of State's Attorneys' offices whose compensation is administered
through the State of Vermont payroll system, except contractual and temporary
employees, and deputy sheriffs paid by the State of Vermont pursuant to
24 V.S.A. § 290(b). The term "employees" shall does not include members of
the General Assembly as such, any person rendering service on a retainer or
fee basis, members of boards or commissions, or persons other than employees
of the Vermont Historical Society, the Vermont Film Corporation, the
Vermont State Employees' Credit Union, Vermont State Employees'
Association, and the Vermont Council on the Arts, whose compensation for
service is not paid from the State Treasury, or any elected or appointed official
unless the except as specifically provided pursuant to this subdivision
(a)(2)(A)(i). The term "employees" includes employees of the Vermont
Historical Society, the Vermont State Employees' Credit Union, the Vermont

2	(iv) For purposes of group hospital-surgical-medical expense
3	insurance, the term "employees" includes members of the General Assembly.
4	(B)(i) The premiums for extending insurance coverage to employees
5	shall be paid in full by the Vermont Historical Society, the Vermont Film
6	Corporation, the Vermont State Employees' Association, the Vermont State
7	Employees' Credit Union, the Vermont Council on the Arts, or their respective
8	retirees. Nothing herein creates a legal obligation on the part of the State of
9	Vermont to pay any portion of the premiums required to extend insurance
10	coverage to this group of employees.
11	(ii) The General Assembly shall pay 80 percent of the cost of the
12	premium for a single plan for members of the General Assembly who elect to
13	enroll in hospital-surgical-medical expense insurance pursuant to this section.
14	The member shall be responsible for the remaining 20 percent of the cost of
15	the premium for a single plan and shall be fully responsible for any additional
16	premium amounts if the member elects to include coverage for one or more of
17	the member's dependents under the plan.

19	(9) The amount of life insurance for any retired employee shall be
20	reduced and limited to \$10,000.00 \$15,000.00 on the date of his or her the

employee's retirement. The provisions of this section shall apply to all retirees

1	who complete 20 creditable years of service with the State before their
2	retirement and are insured for group life insurance on their retirement dates.
3	The total premiums for group life insurance provided under this section and
4	section 632 of this title shall be paid by the State on behalf of employees
5	retired in accordance with the terms of subdivision (2) of this subsection, on
6	behalf of employees who are on sick leave without pay for a period not to
7	exceed 12 months, and on behalf of any employee on disability retirement until
8	proof of total and permanent disability has been accepted by the insurance
9	company.
10	(10) Members of the General Assembly shall be eligible for life
11	insurance in the amount of \$15,000.00 during their term or terms in office.
12	The General Assembly shall pay 75 percent of the cost of the premium for the
13	coverage and the member shall be responsible for the remaining 25 percent.

18	(a) <u>Compensation.</u>
19	(1) <u>Session compensation.</u> Each member of the General Assembly,
20	other than the Speaker of the House and the President Pro Tempore of the

Senate, is entitled to a weekly salary of \$589.00 for the 2005 Biennial Session

1	and thereafter, provided that, beginning on January 1, 2007, the weekly
2	compensation shall be adjusted annually thereafter by the cost of living
3	adjustment negotiated for State employees under the most recent collective
4	bargaining agreement, except that, beginning on July 1, 2021 and annually
5	thereafter on January 1, the weekly compensation shall be adjusted consistent
6	with the compensation increases provided to other constitutional officers. The
7	salary of members shall be paid in biweekly installments.
8	(2) <u>Special session compensation</u> . During a special session, a member is
9	entitled to an amount equal to one-fifth of the annually adjusted weekly
10	compensation set forth in subdivision (1) of this subsection, rounded up to the
11	nearest dollar, for each day of a special session on which the House of which
12	he or she is a that the House in which the member serves shall sit.
13	(3) Adjournment compensation. During adjournment of the General
14	Assembly, a member is entitled to an amount equal to one-tenth of the
15	annually adjusted weekly compensation set forth in subdivision (1) of this
16	subsection (a), rounded up to the nearest dollar, for each week of the
17	adjournment of the General Assembly.

19	Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE

This act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
