11	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to establish a
12	residential peer respite facility that provides support and services to individuals
13	experiencing a mental health crisis.
14 15	An act relating to establishing a residential peer respite facility in southern Vermont
16	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
17	Sec. 1. LEGISLATIVE INTENT
18	It is the intent of the General Assembly that:
19	(1) by increasing the 256 psychiatric residential beds that the
20	Department of Mental Health currently oversees or contracts to augment the

1	number of short-term peer respite beds from two to four, more individuals in
2	crisis will be successfully diverted from inpatient psychiatric settings;
3	(2) by providing adequate residential alternatives to hospitalization for
4	individuals in mental health crisis, Vermonters will have greater access to
5	residential support and various therapeutic options during mental health crisis;
6	(3) by expanding peer-supported programming, individuals in mental
7	health crisis seeking an alternative to hospitalization receive effective,
8	compassionate, and affordable care;
9	(4) the State and those individuals seeking support during a mental
10	health crisis may avoid incurring expensive hospitalization costs; and
11	(5) by providing more residential beds for short to medium-term stays,
12	individuals in mental health crisis will have fewer long-term stays in Vermont
13	hospital emergency departments.
14	Sec. 2. RESIDENTIAL PEER RESPITE FACILITY
15	(a) The Department of Mental Health shall issue a request for proposals to
16	establish a two-bed residential peer respite facility in southern Vermont based
17	on an existing model that provides supports and services to individuals
18	experiencing a mental health crisis.
19	(b) A successful applicant shall ensure that:
20	(1) at least one bed in the facility may be reserved for stays of up to four
21	weeks; and

1	(2) the remaining bed is reserved for short-term residential stays of up to
2	two weeks.
3	(c) On or before January 1, 2024, the Department shall contract with an
4	eligible applicant to establish and operate a residential peer respite facility in
5	accordance with this section.
6	Sec. 3. APPROPRIATION; RESIDENTIAL PEER RESPITE FACILITY
7	In fiscal year 2024, \$515,000.00 is appropriated from the General Fund to
8	the Department of Mental Health for the purpose of contracting with an entity
9	to establish and operate a residential peer respite facility pursuant to Sec. 2
10	(residential peer respite facility) of this act.
11	Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE
12	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
