7	immunity and subject law enforcement officers and those acting at the request

10	rioters. This bill also defines "officer" for clarity.

20	exercises law enforcement powers; a sheriff; a deputy sheriff who exercises

8	(a) Officers An officer, and persons assisting them acting at the request or
9	direction of an officer, in lawfully dispersing or apprehending such rioters,
10	shall not be liable in a civil or criminal proceeding if a rioter, by reason of his
11	or her the rioter's resistance, is killed or injured.
12	(b) In lawfully dispersing or apprehending rioters, officers and persons
13	acting at the request or direction of an officer shall abide by the standards for
14	law enforcement use of force pursuant to 20 V.S.A. § 2368.
15	(c) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section, a failure to abide by the
16	standards for law enforcement use of force pursuant to 20 V.S.A. § 2368 shall
17	subject an officer or a person acting at the request or direction of an officer to
18	civil or criminal liability.
