6	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to clarify a law
7	enforcement officer's ability to obtain a blood sample during a DUI
8	investigation. Specifically, the bill clarifies that a law enforcement officer may
9	obtain a driver's blood sample when reasonable grounds exist to suspect that
10	the driver is under the combined influence of alcohol and a drug.

16	(a)(1) Implied consent. Every person who operates, attempts to operate, or
17	is in actual physical control of any vehicle on a highway in this State is deemed
18	to have given consent to an evidentiary test of that person's breath for the
19	purpose of determining the person's alcohol concentration or the presence of

other drug in the blood. The test shall be administered at the direction of a law
enforcement officer.

3 (2) Blood test. If breath testing equipment is not reasonably available or 4 if the officer has reason to believe that the person is unable to give a sufficient 5 sample of breath for testing or if the law enforcement officer has reasonable 6 grounds to believe that the person is under the influence of a drug other than 7 alcohol, or under the combined influence of alcohol and a drug, the person is 8 deemed to have given consent to the taking of an evidentiary sample of blood. 9 If in the officer's opinion the person is incapable of decision or unconscious or 10 dead, it is deemed that the person's consent is given and a sample of blood 11 shall be taken.
