15	Subject: Salaries and fees; General Assembly; health insurance; legislator
16	compensation and benefits
17	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to make
18	members of the General Assembly eligible for the State employees' health
19	benefit plan at no cost. It would provide members with an annual salary in an
20	amount equal to one-half of the statewide annual average wage, with higher
21	amounts for the Speaker of the House and the President Pro Tempore of the

1	Senate. The bill would provide members with reimbursement for child and
2	dependent care expenses and would reimburse overnight parking costs for
3	legislators with mobility limitations. The bill would also provide per diem
4	compensation and expense reimbursement for members-elect who attend
5	certain pre-session trainings and meetings.

- 12 (a) During adjournment of the General Assembly, any standing committee
 13 or subcommittee of a standing committee may with the appropriate approval of
 14 the Speaker or the President Pro Tempore meet at the call of its chair to
 15 conduct legislative business within the State. For attendance at such a meeting
 16 or for attendance at a meeting of a special committee or joint committee, a
 17 committee member shall be entitled to per diem compensation and expense
 18 reimbursement as follows:
 - (1) daily compensation at the rate then in effect for members of the General Assembly during a special session; [Repealed.]

- (A) Each member shall be eligible to receive reimbursement equal to the actual amounts expended by the member for child care or dependent care services in this State, or both, as set forth in this subdivision (3) for each day the House in which the member serves shall sit. A member shall also be eligible to receive the reimbursement for each day of a special session that the House in which the member serves shall sit and for each day during adjournment of the General Assembly on which the member attends an official meeting of a special committee or joint committee to which the member was appointed by the Speaker of the House or the Senate Committee on Committees, as applicable.

1	(B) The amount of the daily reimbursement available under this
2	subdivision (3) shall not exceed the following amounts for child care or
3	dependent care for each qualifying child and each individual who requires
