6	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to allow the
7	operator and front passenger's windows to be tinted up to 35 percent visible
8	light transmission and the front windshield to be tinted up to 10 percent visible
9	light transmission.

10	An act relating to tinted windows
11	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
12	Sec. 1. 23 V.S.A. § 1125 is amended to read:
13	§ 1125. OBSTRUCTING WINDSHIELDS, WINDOWS
14	(a) As used in this section, "visible light transmission" means the amount
15	of visible light that can pass through shading or tinting material applied to the
16	window or windshield of a motor vehicle.
17	(b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a person an individual
18	shall not operate a motor vehicle on which material or items have been painted
19	or adhered on or over, or hung in back of, any transparent part of a motor
20	vehicle windshield, vent windows, or side windows located immediately to the

windshield; or

or behind the rearview mirror;

I	left and right of the operator. The prohibition of this section on hanging items
2	shall apply only when a hanging item materially obstructs the driver's view.
3	(b)(c) Notwithstanding subsection (a)(b) of this section, a person an
4	individual may operate a motor vehicle with material or items painted or
5	adhered on or over, or hung in back of, the windshield, vent windows, or side
6	windows:

8	(4) if the operator is a person employed by the federal, State, or local
9	government or a volunteer emergency responder operating an authorized
10	emergency vehicle, who places any necessary equipment in back of the
11	windshield of the vehicle, provided the equipment does not interfere with the
12	operator's control of the driving mechanism of the vehicle;
13	(5) on a motor vehicle that is for sale by a licensed automobile dealer
14	prior to the sale of the vehicle, in a space not over three inches high and six
15	inches long in the upper left-hand corner of the windshield, and in a space not
16	over four inches high and 18 inches long in the upper right-hand corner of the

2	rays of the sun and placed on the vent windows or side windows located
3	immediately to the left and right of the operator, provided that the shading or
4	tinting material tints to not less than 35 percent visible light transmission and
5	the shading or tinting material is removed or replaced if it tears, bubbles, or is
6	otherwise worn to prohibit clear vision; or
7	(8) if the object is window shading or tinting material to shield from the
8	rays of the sun and placed on the front windshield, provided that the shading or
9	tinting material tints to not less than 90 percent visible light transmission and
10	the shading or tinting material is removed or replaced if it tears, bubbles, or is
11	otherwise worn to prohibit clear vision.
12	(c)(d) The Notwithstanding subdivision (c)(7) of this section, the
13	Commissioner may grant an exemption to the prohibition of this section
14	maximum allowed window tint upon application from a person an individual
15	required for medical reasons to be shielded from the rays of the sun and who
16	attaches to the application a document signed by a licensed physician or
17	optometrist certifying that shielding from the rays of the sun is a medical
18	necessity. The physician or optometrist certification shall be renewed every
19	four years. However, when a licensed physician or optometrist has previously
20	certified to the Commissioner that an applicant's condition is both permanent
21	and stable, the exemption may be renewed by the applicant without submission

of a form signed by a licensed physician or optometrist. Additionally, the
window shading or tinting permitted under this subsection shall be limited to
the vent windows or side windows located immediately to the left and right of
the operator. The exemption provided in this subsection shall terminate upon
the transfer of the approved vehicle and at that time the applicable window
tinting shall be removed by the seller. Furthermore, if the material described in
this subsection tears, or bubbles, or is otherwise worn to prohibit clear vision,
it shall be removed or replaced.
(d)(e) The rear side windows and the back window may be obstructed only
if the motor vehicle is equipped on each side with a securely attached mirror,
which that provides the operator with a clear view of the roadway in the rear
and on both sides of the motor vehicle.
Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE
This act shall take effect on passage.
