cancer, a subsequent diagnosis of cancer shall be presumed to have resulted

20 connected risk factors or nonservice-connected exposure, provided:

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1	(i)(I) the firefighter completed an initial and any subsequent
2	cancer screening evaluations as recommended by the American Cancer Society
3	based on the age and sex of the firefighter prior to becoming a firefighter or
4	within two years of July 1, 2007 while serving as a firefighter, and the
5	evaluation indicated no evidence of cancer;
6	(II) the firefighter was engaged in firefighting duties or other
7	hazardous activities over a period of at least five years in Vermont prior to the
8	diagnosis; and
9	(III) the firefighter is under 65 years of age.
10	(ii) The presumption shall not apply to any firefighter who has
11	used tobacco products at any time within 10 years of the date of diagnosis.
12	(iii) The disabling cancer shall be limited to leukemia, lymphoma,
13	or multiple myeloma, and cancers originating in the bladder, brain, colon,
14	gastrointestinal tract, kidney, liver, pancreas, skin, or testicles.
15	(F) A firefighter who is diagnosed with cancer within 10 years of the
16	last active date of employment as a firefighter shall be eligible for benefits
17	under this subdivision. The date of injury shall be the date of the last injurious
18	exposure as a firefighter.
19	(G) It is recommended that fire departments maintain incident report
20	records for at least 10 years.
