16	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
17	Sec. 1. CHARTER AMENDMENT APPROVAL
18	The General Assembly approves an amendment to the charter of the City of
19	Burlington as set forth in this act. Voters approved the proposal of amendment
20	on March 7, 2023.

2	CHAPTER 3. CITY OF BURLINGTON
3	* * *
4	§ 5. ELECTION TO BE BY BALLOT; METHOD OF ELECTION;
5	RUNOFF ELECTIONS
6	(a) The election of the Mayor and school commissioners shall be by ballot,
7	and the person or persons receiving a plurality of all votes cast for any office
8	aforesaid shall, except as hereinafter provided, be declared elected thereto.
9	However, if no person receives at least 40 percent of all votes cast for any
10	office aforesaid, no one shall be declared elected and a runoff election shall be
11	held. The only candidates in the runoff election shall be the two persons
12	receiving the greater number of votes or, in case of a tie, the persons receiving
13	the greatest number of votes or the persons receiving the second greatest
14	number of votes. The Chief Administrative Officer shall within seven days
15	warn a runoff election to be held not less than 12 days nor more than 20 days
16	after the date of the warning. The warning shall be published in a newspaper
17	of general circulation in the City and posted in a public place. The person or
18	persons receiving a plurality of all the votes cast in a runoff election shall be
19	declared elected.
20	(b) All elections of the Mayor, City Councilors, school commissioners, and
21	ward election officers shall be by ballot, using a system of ranked choice

1	voting without a separate runoff election. The Chief Administrative Officer
2	shall implement a ranked choice voting protocol according to these guidelines:
