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| 5 | It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont: |

| 8 | (a) The Departments of Health and of Disabilities, Aging, and Independent |
| 9 | Living shall jointly develop and maintain easily accessible electronic, print, |
| 10 | and in-person public education materials and programs on Alzheimer's disease |
| 11 | and related disorders that shall serve as a resource for patients, families, |
| 12 | caregivers, and health care providers. The Departments shall include |
