(b)(1) There are created one or more funds to be held in trust. To these funds shall be credited donations and endowments to the Home with and without specific restrictions on their use. Interest and earnings accruing to the funds created by this subsection shall be credited to the respective fund. The funds deposited pursuant to this subsection shall not be considered funds of the State and shall be used solely for the purposes of this chapter, subject to the terms and conditions of the gift and to the terms and conditions of the donation or endowment.

- (2) Upon deposit with the State Treasurer's Office, the Home may request from the State Treasurer's Office and may retain locally up to \$10,000.00 of donations and endowments, which may be expended consistent with their applicable terms and conditions, for supporting residents of the <a href="https://docs.ncb/home-the-bome-th
- (3) The funds shall be maintained in an account pursuant to 32 V.S.A. § 431.

1	(4) The Chief Executive Officer shall make a report at each scheduled

4	Office, the nature of the funds, the account balance, and any expenditures.
