1	(c) Nonwitnessed Misdemeanor Offenses. If an officer has probable cause
2	to believe a person has committed or is committing a misdemeanor outside the
3	presence of the officer, the officer may issue a citation to appear before a
4	judicial officer in lieu of arrest. The officer may arrest the person without a
5	warrant if the officer has probable cause to believe:

7	(8) The person has committed a misdemeanor which involves an assault
8	against a family member, or against a household member, as defined in 15
9	V.S.A. § 1101(2), or a child of such a family or household member.

11	(14) The person has violated 13 V.S.A. § 1023 (simple assault).
