6	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to add breast
7	cancer, thyroid cancer, and cancers originating in the reproductive system to
8	the cancers for which a firefighter may be eligible to receive workers'
9	compensation.

11	cancer
12	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
13	Sec. 1. 21 V.S.A. § 601 is amended to read:
14	§ 601. DEFINITIONS
15	Unless the context otherwise requires, words and phrases used in this
16	chapter shall be construed as follows As used in this chapter:
17	* * *
18	(11) "Personal injury by accident arising out of and in the course of
19	employment" includes an injury caused by the willful act of a third person
20	directed against an employee because of that employment.

1	* * *
2	(E) In the case of a firefighter, as defined in 20 V.S.A. § 3151(3) and
3	(4), who dies or has a disability from a cancer listed in subdivision (iii) of this
4	subdivision (E), the firefighter shall be presumed to have had the cancer as a
5	result of exposure to conditions in the line of duty, unless it is shown by a
6	preponderance of the evidence that the cancer was caused by nonservice-
7	connected risk factors or nonservice-connected exposure, provided:
8	(i)(I) the firefighter completed an initial and any subsequent
9	cancer screening evaluations as recommended by the American Cancer Society
10	based on the age and sex of the firefighter prior to becoming a firefighter or
11	within two years of July 1, 2007, and the evaluation indicated no evidence of
12	cancer;
13	(II) the firefighter was engaged in firefighting duties or other
14	hazardous activities over a period of at least five years in Vermont prior to the
15	diagnosis; and
16	(III) the firefighter is under 65 years of age.
17	(ii) The presumption shall not apply to any firefighter who has
18	used tobacco products at any time within 10 years of the date of diagnosis.
19	(iii) The disabling cancer shall be limited to leukemia, lymphoma,
20	or multiple myeloma, and cancers originating in the bladder, brain, breast,

1	colon, gastrointestinal tract, kidney, liver, pancreas, reproductive system, skin,
2	or testicles <u>thyroid</u> .
3	(F) A firefighter who is diagnosed with cancer within 10 years of the
4	last active date of employment as a firefighter shall be eligible for benefits
5	under this subdivision. The date of injury shall be the date of the last injurious
6	exposure as a firefighter.
7	(G) It is recommended that fire departments:
8	(i) maintain incident report records for at least 10 years; and
9	(ii) offer or provide annual cancer screenings to all firefighters
10	who are employed by or who volunteer for the department.
