7	(a) For the purposes of <u>As used in</u> this section:

9	(3) "Livable wage" means the hourly wage required in an urban or rural
10	area for a full-time worker to pay for one-half of the basic needs budget for a
11	two-person household with no children and who lives in shared housing and
12	has employer-assisted health insurance averaged for both urban and rural areas
13	to pay for the basic needs budget.
14	(b) On or before January 15 of each new legislative biennium, beginning in
15	2009, the Joint Fiscal Office shall report the calculated basic needs budgets of
16	various representative household configurations and the calculated livable
17	wage for both urban and rural areas for the previous year. This calculation
18	may serve as an additional indicator of wage and other economic conditions in
19	the State and shall not be considered official State guidance on wages or other
20	forms of compensation.

1	(c) The methodology for calculating basic needs budgets shall be built on
2	methodology described in the November 9, 1999 Livable Income Study 2023
3	Basic Needs Budget Technical Advisory Committee report, modified as
4	appropriate by any statutory changes made by the General Assembly and
5	subsequent modifications adopted by the Joint Fiscal Committee under
6	subsection (d) of this section.
7	* * *
8	(e) It is the intent of the General Assembly that the methodology for
9	calculating the basic needs budget and livable wage shall be updated every six
10	years or more frequently to ensure that it continues to reflect the actual cost to
11	maintain a basic standard of living in Vermont.

13	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
