H.C.R. 37

House concurrent resolution honoring former Halifax Fire Chief Wayne Courser for his exemplary volunteer leadership and community service

Offered by: Representative Roberts of Halifax

<u>Whereas</u>, the 70 years of Wayne Courser's association with the Halifax Fire Company Inc. started when he was a teenager in 1953, and

<u>Whereas</u>, in 1957, Wayne Courser also became a part-time member of the Halifax road crew, a role that became full-time in 1962, and he continued as a crew member until stepping down in 1997, and

Whereas, his road-working tenure included two terms as Halifax Road Commissioner, first, from 1959 to 1960, and then again, from 1966 to 1973, and

<u>Whereas</u>, although his contribution to the maintenance and enhancement of town roads was commendable, Wayne Courser's true passion was serving as a fire fighter, and his colleagues elected him as assistant chief in 1961, and as chief in 1970, a position he held with pride and distinction until early 2023, and

<u>Whereas</u>, in 1975, Wayne Courser spearheaded the effort to construct a new firehouse, which remains in use, and he has also held the office of president of Halifax Fire Company Inc., and

<u>Whereas</u>, his fire company involvement extended beyond standard responsibilities, with his enthusiastic work as a contributor, leader, organizer, and fundraiser, who even personally purchased a 1986 fire truck and donated it to the department, and

<u>Whereas</u>, Wayne and his wife, Joan, reside next door to the firehouse, his dependability is legendary, and his legacy as chief is one for others to emulate, now therefore be it

House concurrent resolution honoring former Waterbury Municipal Manager William Shepeluk in recognition of his extraordinary public service career

<u>Whereas</u>, Bill Shepeluk graduated as a political science major from the University of Massachusetts and earned a master's degree in public administration from Syracuse University, and

<u>Whereas</u>, as Brighton Town Manager from 1982 to 1988, Bill Shepeluk polished his already outstanding municipal administrative skills, and

<u>Whereas</u>, in 1988, the Town of Waterbury hired Bill Shepeluk to serve as its municipal manager, a role he retained for a remarkable 34 years and nine months, and

<u>Whereas</u>, although always shunning the limelight, his many supervisory accomplishments included improving the town's financial structure, major water-associated infrastructure improvements, and the complex merger of the town and village, and

<u>Whereas</u>, twice, the Waterbury Selectboard and Village Trustees presented Bill Shepeluk with the Keith A. Wallace Memorial Community Service Award, and he was the town's first honorary firefighter, and

<u>Whereas</u>, Bill Shepeluk served on the Board of the Vermont League of Cities and Towns (the League), as the organization's president, and repeatedly as immediate past president, and he also sat on the Board of the League's Health Trust (now known as VERB), and, for approximately three decades, was its president, and

<u>Whereas</u>, the League honored him as Municipal Person of the Year, and the Vermont Town and City Manager's Association named him Municipal Manager of the Year, now therefore be it
