


Vermont's Earned Income Tax Credit

- Increased to 38% of the federal EITC in 2022
- For workers with low and moderate earnings
- Adjusts for household earnings and number of children—<u>see the EITC Estimator</u>
- Fully refundable (can get the full value in cash)
- Now available regardless of immigration status




Vermont Child Tax Credit

- New beginning in tax year 2022
- \$1,000 annually per child under 6
- Full credit for families with income \$0-\$125,000
- Partial credit with income up to \$175,000
- Fully refundable (can get the full value in cash)
- Now available regardless of immigration status



Minimum wage leaves families in poverty, and far from meeting basic needs




Note: This graphic uses the most recent data available from 2022 and 2024. Minimum wage reflects the annual wages for one full-time earner.

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
Increase the Value of Refundable Anti-Poverty Tax Credits

Extend the Credits to Those Left Out

Make Anti-Poverty Tax Credits Easy to Access

Even counting other benefits, Reach Up falls short

Maximum monthly benefits, Reach Up basic needs and Joint Fiscal Office basic needs estimate, family of four, 2022
