- Today's farmers face a very different land scape then prior generations:
  - o Increased land prices and competition
  - No replicable commodity based business model
  - Need to access higher margin direct to consumer markets
- These farmers provide the backbone of our rural economy through
  - Employment and economic activity
  - Keeping land open and active
  - Providing healthy food
- This legislation is essential because it helps provide clarity
  - Around what activities are permissible
  - Does not add additional regulatory burden
    - Act 250-Lack of application does not mean other regulatory concerns are not addressed
  - Allows farmers to support each other in accessing markets
    - Complimentary products
    - Meeting consumer demands
- It is imperfect but reflects a move to address shortcomings of previous legislation
