9	<u>§ 4631. Small Farmer Diversification and Transition Program</u>
10	(a) The Small Farmer Diversification and Transition Program is created at
11	the Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets to provide small farmers in
12	Vermont with State financial assistance to diversify production on a farm or to
13	transition from one form of farming to another. Assistance under the Program
14	shall be in the form of grants. Small Farmer Diversification and Transition
15	Program grants shall be used for costs of:
16	(1) diversifying the farm products produced by the applicant;
17	(2) transitioning the applicant from one form of farming to another;
18	(3) processing of farm products on the farm owned by the applicant; and
19	(4) development of an accessory on-farm business by the applicant.
20	(b) An applicant for a Small Farmer Diversification and Transition
21	Program grant shall demonstrate to the Secretary of Agriculture, Food and

1	(1) the applicant is a small farmer;
2	(2) the applicant houses not more than the number of animals specified
3	under section 4857 of this title;
4	(3) there is potential from the proposed diversification or transition to
5	create additional income for the small farmer;
6	(4) the applicant has a proposed plan for diversification or transition that
7	includes possible markets for the proposed product and probable income; and
8	(5) the applicant is not permitted as a medium farm or large farm at the
9	time of application.
10	(c)(1) The Secretary of Agriculture, Food and Markets shall issue Small
11	Farmer Diversification and Transition Program grants under this section when
12	funds are available for the Program. The maximum amount of a grant under
13	this section shall be \$15,000.00 per farmer per year, and all projects funded by
14	the grant shall be completed within 12 months of receipt of the grant by the
15	small farmer.
16	(d)(1) The Secretary shall provide public notice of available grants and
17	shall provide applicants with technical assistance in complying with
18	application requirements. The Secretary shall publicize the Small Farmer
19	Diversification and Transition Program in newsletters, press releases, e-mail,
20	and other communications from the Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets.

1	(2) The Secretary shall hold the application process open beginning
1	
2	November 1 of each year and shall close the application period on December
3	31 of each year.
4	(3) Applications shall not be processed until the Secretary determines
5	that the application is administratively complete and includes all required
6	documentation required by the Secretary.
7	(4)(A) The Secretary shall evaluate applications based on the following
8	criteria, which shall be weighted equally:
9	(i) the potential from the proposed diversification or transition to
10	create additional income for the small farmer; and
11	(ii) the viability of the possible markets identified in the plan for
12	the proposed product.
13	(B) The Secretary shall award grants to the applicants according to
14	the total weighted scores beginning with the highest score until all funds are
15	expended.
16	(e) As used in this subchapter:
17	(1) "Farm products" means:
18	(A) crops grown, growing, or to be grown, including:
19	(i) plants grown for food, feed, and fiber, but excluding trees
20	grown for timber purposes;
