Workforce

Information & Access provides library services to legislators and SOV employees, maintains the VT Online Library collection of databases, and oversees the state-wide Interlibrary Loan system. Library Advancement provides consultation services to libraries statewide; administers federal grants; and provides direct service to users of the ABLE Library Audio/Braille/Large Print, Electronic Resources (ABLE).
