Dear Vermont Legislature,

I am the mother and guardian of a son with Down syndrome and Autism (Pervasive Developmental Delay, diagnosed at age 3). Patrick is 31 years old, lives with us, and requires 24/7 care and supervision. My husband Terence and I are concerned about his future housing and support once we are no longer able to care for him.

I would like to share my personal input for a desired housing model in The Converse Home ,Burlington, Vt. When our mother experienced decline due to Alzheimer's Disease, my siblings and I felt tremendous peace of mind upon entrusting her care to The Converse Home staff (notably, the memory unit) , for the 24/7 safe , service supported housing she required and deserved.

As an RN I had the unique privilege to observe Patrick, always comfortable, while visiting his grandmother in this secure professional setting. Through the 4 years of her residency there, I often felt that this would be an ideal home atmosphere for Patrick as he ages. This location not only accommodates individuals with and without changing health needs through assisted living, but also affords a downtown housing model with medical supervision, daily meals and enriching activities.

I am writing today to ask for your support (\$9 million) for implementation of the three pilot grant projects and annual development of service supported housing for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD). The State of Vermont needs to develop 602 new units of service supported housing for individuals who, like our son, have I/DD.

Please help us create a secure future for our adult son and others by provision of the necessary funding in the FY2025 Budget for service supported housing.
