The UK age-appropriate design codes

- Kids Codes, AADC, or design codes
- Data Protection Act (DPA) protects individual privacy and data rights in the UK
- Issued the age-appropriate design codes to help companies comply with the DPA when children use a platform

Data: Platforms' press releases announcing changes related to the design codes

May 2018 - September 2023

- 2018 Start of the Data Protection Act
- 2021 Full enforcement of the design codes
- September 2023 2 years after full enforcement of the UK design codes

The UK Design Codes

Prescriptive Codes

Tell a company exactly what to do

E.G. Strong default privacy settings

Consistent across platforms

Non-Prescriptive Codes

Sets a high goal with few concrete steps

E.G. Best interest of the child or age appropriate design

Variable across platforms

Novel approaches and features



Non-prescriptive examples

Instagram will notify minors when they are interacting with an adult who has been flagged for suspicious behavior.

On YouTube, the dislike count is private across the platform, to minimize harassment of content creators.

On TikTok, certain search terms will now be directed to resources about the dangers of human smuggling and trafficking

The UK Design Codes

1. Best interests of the child

3. Age appropriate application

7. Default settings

The best interests of the child should be a primary consideration when you design and develop online services likely to be accessed by a child.

The age range of your audience and the different needs of children at different ages and stages of development should be at the heart of how you design your service and apply this code.

Settings must be 'high privacy' by default.



Methods

Platform Selection

- 1. Platforms with more than 45 million monthly users in the EU
- 2. Top social media platforms used by youth (Youtube, TikTok, SnapChat, and Instagram)
- 3. E-commerce platform and search engine with the largest market shares in both the UK and US (Amazon Marketplace and Google Search)

Age-Appropriate Design

• TikTok's "curfew" on push notifications has different settings for younger adolescents compared to older adolescents


Youth Safety and Well-Being

 TikTok updated its reporting mechanisms in the app and clarified them in their guidelines

Privacy/Security and Data Management

- On Instagram, users can no longer tag minors who do not follow them
- Instagram allows users to revoke third-party app access to new content on their accounts

Platforms will comply





4 domains

Time Management

Curfews on push notifications, tools to manage screen time

Age-Appropriate Design

 Designs and features are more customized to specific developmental stages (e.g. young vs older teens)

Youth Safety and Well-Being

 Better reporting mechanisms, easier for users to hide content, harder for adults to contact minors

Privacy/Security and Data Management

Strong default privacy settings, easier for minors to delete their information
