1	TO THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:
2	The Committee on Commerce and Economic Development to which was
3	referred Senate Bill No. 73 entitled "An act relating to workers' compensation
4	coverage for firefighters with cancer" respectfully reports that it has considered
5	the same and recommends that the House propose to the Senate that the bill be
6	amended as follows:
7	First: In Sec. 1, 21 V.S.A. § 601, definitions, in subdivision (11)(E)(iii),
8	after "liver," by inserting "lung,"
9	Second: By striking out Secs. 2 and 3 in their entireties and inserting in lieu
10	thereof Secs. 2, 3, and 4 to read as follows:
11	Sec. 2. ANNUAL CANCER SCREENINGS; PERSONAL PROTECTIVE
12	EQUIPMENT UPGRADES; REPORT
13	(a) On or before January 15, 2024, the Director of the Division of Fire
14	Safety shall submit a written report to the House Committees on
15	Appropriations, on Commerce and Economic Development, and on
16	Government Operations and Military Affairs and the Senate Committees on
17	Appropriations; on Economic Development, Housing and General Affairs; and
18	on Government Operations regarding the following topics:
19	(1) the projected cost for the State to fund annual or biennial cancer
20	screenings for all career and volunteer firefighters in Vermont;
21	(2) the projected cost for the State to fund cancer screenings for all

1	enrollees in the Vermont Fire Academy Firefighter I certification program	
2	prior to the commencement of training;	
3	(3) potential opportunities for the State to reduce the cost for fire	
4	departments to provide annual cancer screenings for their firefighters;	
5	(4) the projected cost for the State to fund the replacement of personal	
6	protective equipment for all volunteer and career firefighters on a rolling basis	
7	so that all personal protective equipment is replaced within 10 years after being	
8	acquired; and	
9	(5) potential opportunities for the State to reduce the cost to fire	
10	departments for the replacement of personal protective equipment.	
11	(b) The report may include recommendations for legislative action to	
12	facilitate:	
13	(1) the early identification of cancer in firefighters;	
14	(2) the acquisition of personal protective equipment by fire departments;	
15	<u>and</u>	
16	(3) the elimination of PFAS and other carcinogens in firefighting	
17	equipment.	
18	Sec. 3. WORKERS' COMPENSATION FOR FIREFIGHTERS WITH	
19	CANCER; ELIGIBILITY	
20	(a) On or before January 15, 2024, the Commissioners of Labor and of	
21	Financial Regulation, in consultation with the Director of the Division of Fire	

1	Safety, shall submit a written report to the House Committee on Commerce
2	and Economic Development and the Senate Committee on Economic
3	Development, Housing and General Affairs regarding the following topics:
4	(1) the potential impacts on workers' compensation claims, premiums,
5	and loss costs of amending or repealing the provisions of 21 V.S.A.
6	§ 601(11)(E) that bar a firefighter from the presumption that the firefighter's
7	cancer resulted from work-related exposure if the firefighter:
8	(A) is over 65 years of age; or
9	(B) has used tobacco products within the last 10 years;
10	(2) the potential impacts on workers' compensation claims, premiums,
11	and loss costs of amending 21 V.S.A. § 601(11)(E)(iii) to expand the list of
12	cancers presumed to have been caused by exposure to working conditions as a
13	firefighter, including:
14	(A) additional types of cancer:
15	(i) that occur more frequently in firefighters than the general
16	public;
17	(ii) that are caused by carcinogens to which firefighters are
18	exposed in the line of duty; or
19	(iii) both; or
20	(B) all forms of cancer; and
21	(3) potential methods for apportioning liability for workers'

1	compensation in instances where a firefighter has been employed by more than
2	one fire department, including when a firefighter is employed as a career
3	firefighter by one department and a volunteer firefighter by another
4	department.
5	(b) The report may include recommendations for legislative action to:
6	(1) amend or repeal the provisions of 21 V.S.A. § 601(11)(E) that bar a
7	firefighter from the presumption that the firefighter's cancer resulted from
8	work-related exposure if the firefighter is over 65 years of age or has used
9	tobacco products within the last 10 years; and
10	(2) amend 21 V.S.A. § 601(11)(E)(iii) to expand the list of cancers
11	presumed to have been caused by exposure to working conditions as a
12	firefighter to include either:
13	(A) additional specific cancers for which firefighters have a
14	significantly increased risk in comparison to the general public; or
15	(B) all forms of cancer.
16	Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE
17	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
