RE: FY24 Appropriations

Dear Chair Marcotte and Members of the House Committee on Commerce and Economic Development,

On behalf of the Vermont Association of Planning and Development Agencies (the state association for Vermont's regional planning commissions), thank you for your work to address Vermont's economy and community development. Our towns and villages need help. The capacity of our towns is strained, which has resulted in towns not taking full advantage of federal and state funding opportunities. We, as the eleven regional planning commissions (RPCs), want to provide the help that our towns need.

To do this, we are asking the Legislature to provide full statutory formula funding from the property transfer tax (PTT) to the RPCs. Supporting letters from each RPC are attached.

The continued underfunding of RPCs has resulted in lost opportunities and support for our towns. The PTT funding is the foundation that RPCs use to provide support to leverage federal and state resources. And receipts from the PTT have increased dramatically due to the volume of high-end real estate transactions. Now is the time to fully fund the RPCs.

1. Please support full statutory formula funding for the RPCs increasing the Governor's FY24 recommendation of \$4,711,650 to the full property transfer tax formula amount of \$10,134,624. This is Sec. D.100(3)(A)

Here are all the other budget items we support:

\$1,000,000.00 in fiscal year 2024 to regional planning commissions for the purposes of brownfields assessment. In awarding funds under this section, the Secretary, in consultation with VAPDA, shall select one regional planning commission to administer these funds. To ensure statewide availability, the selected regional planning commission shall subgrant to regional planning commissions with brownfield programs, with not more than 10 percent of the funds being used for administrative purposes.

From Sec. B.1100 FISCAL YEAR 2024 ONE-TIME GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS (27) \$35,650,000 to the Department of Housing and Community Development for the following:
(D) \$500,000 for Municipal Bylaw Modernization Grants established in 24 V.S.A. § 4307, to assist municipalities in updating their bylaws to reflect the changes proposed in H.68 as introduced on January 19, 2023

We generally support additional investments in housing, economic development, land conservation, transportation, and climate/energy. Please let us know if you have any specific questions on specific budget items.
